



Pam Pontones has served at the Indiana State Department of Health since 1990. She began her career as a microbiologist in the ISDH Laboratory and transitioned to the Epidemiology Resource Center in 1999. Since 2009, Pam has served as State Epidemiologist overseeing programs including infectious disease epidemiology, vectorborne and zoonotic diseases, syndromic surveillance, Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System, and public health geographics. She also serves as an agency spokesperson for infectious diseases and other health issues. In February 2017, she was appointed deputy state health commissioner, assuming oversight for the Office of Public Health Performance Management (OPHPM) and the agency's quality improvement efforts.

Pam is an adjunct faculty member for the IU Richard M. Fairbanks School of Public Health and has been a member of the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists since 2010. She was a scholar in the 2010 National Public Health Leadership Institute and a fellow in the 2001 Mid-America Regional Public Health Leadership Institute. She graduated cum laude from Indiana University Bloomington with a BA in biology and minor in journalism and holds a MA in microbiology from IU.
